

RULES REGARDING BRINGING A DOG ON TO SEAGULL TOURIST PARK

If you want to bring a dog onto the park you must follow the procedure below -
NO VISITORS' DOGS ALLOWED!

You cannot bring a new dog on site **until** you have a Dog Passport which the park manager will issue.

TO OBTAIN A DOG PASSPORT

1. No 'Specially Controlled Dogs' as detailed in the Dangerous Dogs Act of 1991 (Amended 1997) are permitted on the park. Only suitable breeds will be accepted so check with the manager first.
2. An up-to-date photo with you and your dog must be taken before your dog can stay. The photo will be seen by other park owners so that dogs and owners can be identified.
3. Dog name and collar details recorded.
4. A fee will be charged per dog to register. This is currently £80.00 per dog.
5. You must agree to consult with the managers if you wish to make any changes.
6. Passports cannot be transferred to another dog. The new dog will have to register with the above criteria and pay the current registration fee.
7. It must be clearly understood that Seagull Tourist Park does not own land outside the camping fields and so it is not possible to make dog exercise areas.
8. You agree to keep your dog on a lead at all times and to pick up your dog mess.
9. If you see another dog fouling the park you must agree to report it to the manager.
10. If you see any dogs on site which you believe are not registered (such as strays), please report to the manager.
11. Dogs are not to be left in their owners caravans unattended.
12. Persistently noisy dogs will not be permitted on site
13. Any owner who does not adhere to the above will be asked to stop bringing their dog to the site or vacate their pitch at the park owner's discretion.
14. Your visitors are not allowed to bring a dog to the park unless they have a dog passport also.
